



Wings or not? Do we become angels when we die?

We've all heard it. We may've even said it. When someone dies, a common sentiment is "He's got his wings now" or "She's joined God's angelic choir." Part of the mental image that many people have about the afterlife is that we become angels after death. They see it as a step up from this life: flying through the celestial paradise, swooping here and there, perhaps even strumming a harp. Of course, it's natural that we want our loved ones to be in a better, happier place. We all understand the sentiment.

But there's a big problem with it. It's bad theology.

We **don't** become angels when we die. We don't get wings. Or harps (as far as I know!)

The reason is because human beings and angels are two entirely separate groups within the created order. At the present time, angels are greater than we are because God made us a little lower than the angels (Psalm 8:5). But in heaven we'll be higher than the angels—because we'll be like Jesus. 1 Corinthians 6:3 says *Do you not know that we will judge angels?* While this may refer to the fallen angels who chose to follow Satan, it still implies that our status after death will be above that of angels. Thus, becoming an angel can be viewed as a downgrade since we'd be going from God's highest and best creatures to something below them. A promotion to angelhood would be a demotion for humanity.

The Bible doesn't tell us when God created angels, but it does show us examples

of what they do. Angels serve as armed guards (Genesis 3:24). They form the heavenly choir (Isaiah 6:2-3). They fight evil (Revelation 12:7-9). And they serve as messengers from God (Genesis 18:1; Judges 6:11; Luke 1:11). One passage in particular sums up their vocation well: Are they not all ministering spirits sent out to serve for the sake of those who are to inherit salvation? (Hebrews 1:14).

One of the ways that angels serve God is by serving us, the heirs of salvation. In that respect, angels are like everything else in this world: when God's hands fashioned them, he had his eyes on us. The Father formed the heights of the mountains, the roaring seas, the sunlight, the animals, all for humanity's benefit and enjoyment. Angels serve God and serve us! As young parents spend months preparing everything for the birth of their child, so God spent five days preparing the heavens and the earth for the sixth day—when he created human beings who bear his image and likeness, who serve as his stewards here on earth.

Since angels seem so much higher, mightier, and more majestic than us, it may be hard to believe that they're actually beneath us in God's plan of creation and salvation. That's probably because we look at ourselves as we are and not as who we are in Christ.

Hebrews 1-2 shows the superiority of the Son of God to angels. The angels worship him, not he them (1:6). Christ sits at the Father's right hand, not angels (1:13). The world to come is not subjected to angels but to Jesus (2:1-8). We don't see this yet. What do we see? We see him who for a little while was made lower than the angels, namely Jesus, crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone" (2:9).

Jesus didn't do this for himself but for us—for everyone—as the verse says. Christ endured death so that through him the Father might bring many...to glory (2:10). In other words, the glory, the reign, and the enthronement of Christ at the Father's right hand are also ours! What happened to the Head happens also to the Body. That's why Paul can make the astonishing claim that God not only made us alive with Christ, but raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus (Ephesians 2:6). Already in Christ we're raised. Already in Christ we're seated on the Father's throne. Already in Christ we're regal rulers over the universe.

If we did become angels after death, what a disapointment that would be!

No longer would we be humans with whom Jesus shares the intimate bond of flesh and blood. No longer would we be those who reign with him. No longer would we be

likeness of God. No longer would we be ones for whom Jesus was willing to die.

In God's plan of creation and salvation, for humans to become angels would be a serious downgrade. No longer could we say, "Christ died for me." Therefore, when Christians die, heaven doesn't "get another angel." We cannot become angels any more than we can become giraffes or ocean waves or stars. When believers in Christ die, we go to be with our Lord, to enjoy paradise, and to receive our resurrection bodies. Then, we'll live and rejoice in the new creation that'll have no end. Not as angels, but as our true spiritual selves, redeemed and made perfect for all eternity.
